Resolution of the OGP Steering Committee Regarding the Participation Status of Greece in the Open Government Partnership 15 April 2024

The Criteria & Standards Subcommittee extends its appreciation to the Government of Greece for its engagement in the Open Government Partnership (OGP) and acknowledges the five OGP action plans it has co-created thus far.

In February 2021, the Government of Greece was placed under Procedural Review due to acting contrary to the OGP process in two consecutive action plan cycles: not delivering an action plan in 2018, and failing to meet minimum co-creation requirements in its 2019-22 action plan). Furthermore, the Government of Greece has not met the minimum co-creation requirements in its 2022-24 action plan.

Considering that the Government of Greece has now acted contrary to the OGP process for three consecutive action plan cycles, and in line with the fair and consistent approach to upholding OGP requirements for all participating countries, the **Criteria & Standards Subcommittee resolves to maintain the Government of Greece under Procedural Review until the OGP's Independent Reporting Mechanism (IRM) confirms compliance with minimum implementation requirements in its 2022-2024 action plan.** This assessment will be part of the Action Plan Results Report, to be published within four months after completing implementation of the plan. Failure to meet the minimum requirements or adhere to the OGP process in any other way (e.g. missing the action plan delivery deadline of 31 December 2024) may lead to a recommendation to the full Steering Committee to designate the Government of Greece as inactive.

The Criteria & Standards Subcommittee remains committed to provide all necessary support to address this issue promptly.
