For centuries, the Municipality of Bar has inherited and preserved the intercultural harmony and unity of all confessions and ethnicities, which adds to its uniqueness.

Bar is a port city, with significant economic, tourist and investment potentials, which require effective local management system and services, capable of addressing the needs of the growing economic sector and the general population, in accordance with good government principles and best European practices. In recent years, the municipality of Bar has recorded a constant increase in the number of inhabitants. The municipality particularly demonstrated its solidarity and openness by facilitating reception and protection of displaced persons from war-affected areas in Ukraine which currently count about 10% of the total population in Bar.

Our local self-government is implementing necessary public administration reforms and is taking significant steps to improve the administrative response to the direct needs of citizens. We see OGP Local as an additional impetus for further reforms and a model that could provide multiple positive effects at the local level. Given the aspiration of Montenegro to join the community of EU members states, this kind of support will increase our capacity to implement the European standards and regulations and better prepare for the full-fledged membership in the EU.

On February 3, 2012, Montenegro became a member of the OGP initiative and adopted the Declaration on Open Government. By accepting this Declaration, we demonstrate our

commitment to apply a pragmatic and visionary approach to sustainable development and further encourage the cooperation between local governmental and non-governmental actors.
