
Fiscal Openness in the Nordic+ Region

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- ➤ **High levels of transparency:** Fiscal transparency has been an area of great achievement for members of the Open Government Partnership (OGP), including the Nordic+ region.
- ➤ Focus on public participation: Most OGP commitments on fiscal openness focus on transparency, despite commitments with participatory elements showing even stronger results in opening government. The Open Budget Survey notes that Nordic+ countries provide few opportunities for public participation in the budget process.
- ➤ Improvements in open procurement: According to the Global Data

 Barometer, the Nordic+ region publishes quality budget and spending data,
 but many countries could improve the publication of open contracting data.



GLOBAL TRENDS IN OGP

- ➤ **Popular policy area:** Fiscal openness commitments are the most popular policy area addressed across OGP action plans. Since 2011, 107 OGP members have made a total of 760 fiscal openness commitments.
- ➤ Importance of citizen involvement: A majority of fiscal openness commitments focus on increasing the transparency of fiscal information, but commitments that include participatory and oversight elements show even stronger results.

WHAT ARE OGP MEMBERS DOING?

- ➤ **Publishing budgets** and other fiscal information in accessible language, including COVID-19 emergency funds and public debt
- Increasing public participation in budgeting, specifically participation of women and under-represented groups
 - Opening budgetary oversight through feedback mechanisms

NORDIC+ STATE OF FISCAL OPENNESS

COMMITMENT EXAMPLES

Finland (2017-2019): The public in Finland can access all non-sensitive government procurement data without having to submit information requests following the creation of an online platform.

Scotland (2017; 2018-2020):
Scotland achieved strong results
through OGP by publishing its first open data
sets on public procurement and implementing
participatory budgeting through the
Community Choices program.

Germany (2023-2025): At the subnational level, <u>Berlin</u> and <u>Schleswig-Holstein</u> are committed to opening budget data and creating accessible visualizations.
