


COMMITMENT PERFORMANCE

Commitments in Asia and the Pacific perform similarly to other regions, according to the IRM.²



OVERVIEW OF THEMATIC AREAS

OGP members in Asia and the Pacific have made hundreds of commitments related to topics covered in the Open Gov Challenge. Below are the most popular thematic areas.³





Twenty-three local members in the region have made over **80 commitments** covering a wide range of policy areas, such as inclusion, fiscal openness, and access to information.

Open Government Partnership

Open Gov Challenge Commitments

Digital Gift Declaration Register for Public Officials

Armenia plans to create a <u>unified, public</u> <u>register</u> for the automatic declaration of gifts given to public officials, which will be checked for compliance.

Improve the Public Procurement Process

Larena (Philippines) <u>committed</u> to creating an oversight team to improve the transparency and efficiency of its public procurement process, in line with a strategy co-created with civil society.

Online Platform to Publish Political Finance Data

Mongolia <u>improved</u> the publication and availability of public procurement data by transitioning to a digital bid submission and catalogue system on <u>tender.gov.mn</u>.

Institutionalize the Baguio City People's Council

Baguio (Philippines) <u>committed</u> to formalizing the role and resources of the council and conducting training to ensure that CSOs meaningfully participate in decision-making.

Amend Laws to Expand Whistleblower Protection and Support

The Republic of Korea <u>committed</u> to amending its current legal framework to ensure consistency in the financial support and protections for whistleblowers and to expand the list of public interest violations.



OGP Action Plan Commitments

ANTI-CORRUPTION

Public Company Beneficial Ownership Register

Armenia <u>published</u> the company beneficial owners of all sectors in a <u>public register</u> that automatically verifies submissions and <u>committed</u> to making this data interoperable with public procurement data.

CIVIC SPACE

Legal Protection on Environmental Cases

Indonesia <u>committed</u> to preparing recommendations that will serve as the foundation for the legal protection of environmental defenders.

Participation and Accountability in Public Procurement

Mongolia <u>improved</u> the publication and availability of public procurement data by transitioning to a digital bid submission and catalogue system on <u>tender.gov.mn</u>.

Ensuring Media Freedom and Freedom of Expression

Mongolia <u>committed</u> to aligning key laws with international norms to ensure transparency, safeguard journalists' rights, and promote an independent media free from political interference.

OGP PROCESS

Multi-stakeholder forum: About half of countries in the region (6 of 11) have a regular multi-stakeholder forum, per the latest IRM evaluation.

CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

Open, Centralized Data on Natural Resources

Indonesia <u>aimed to publish</u> standardized, centralized government-held data related to natural resources, the environment, and spatial planning, linking data from the national and regional governments.

DIGITAL GOVERNANCE

Outreach Campaign to Improve Media Literacy

Australia <u>committed</u> to funding outreach programs to improve the media literacy of culturally and linguistically diverse communities, who are vulnerable to misinformation and disinformation.

INCLUSIVE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Participatory Budgeting Implementation

Armavir (Armenia) <u>committed</u> to implementing participatory budgeting to collaborate with community members to identify projects for funding.

Increase in Local RTI Ordinances

The Philippines <u>tripled</u> the number of local government units that passed right to information ordinances or executive orders in two years, which <u>led to</u> a greater access to information at the local level.

LOCALIZING OPEN GOVERNMENT

Regional Consultations for Participatory Budgeting

Papua New Guinea <u>hosted</u> four regional consultations for members of the public to provide input on the national budget for the first time in the country.

Law to Increase Transparency in Extractive Industries

Mongolia <u>committed</u> to creating a centralized, public database for information on extractive industries, covering national, state, and local governments, as well as private and mixed legal status companies.

Plans to Implement the Algorithm Charter

New Zealand <u>committed</u> to implementing its <u>Algorithm Charter</u> by consulting with signatory agencies on how to better understand and address the risk of using algorithms in their work.

Community Engagement Tool for Policy-Making

New Zealand <u>now encourages</u> the use of this tool to open public participation in policymaking, such as involving communities in the response to crisis situations.

Public Engagement Platform for Policy-Making

The Republic of Korea launched a <u>platform</u> to create <u>opportunities</u> for public engagement on policy-making. The country also <u>committed</u> to improving the platform to increase public engagement.

EITI Standard Implementation at the Local Level

The Philippines <u>committed</u> increasing local government capacity to implement the EITI Standard, such as by building a central, public platform where local governments can report data on extractive industries.

OGP PROCESS

Reasoned response: Most countries in the region (8 of 11) explained to co-creation participants why their inputs were or were not included in the latest action plan, per the latest IRM evaluation.

OGP standing: Nearly all countries in the region are acting according to the OGP process. Two countries (Kyrgyz Republic and Sri Lanka) are currently under procedural review.
